New exhibition at 21 Woodlands Terrace

The Common Guild's new exhibition with American artist **Spencer Finch** opens this **Saturday 25th October**.

Spencer Finch works in a broad range of forms, from large-scale installations to more intimate drawings and photographs. Whatever the scale, his work has consistently combined a rigorous, conceptual approach with a profoundly humane warmth and wit.

This exhibition focuses on Finch's works on paper - predominantly watercolours - and demonstrates his enduring interest in the relationships between colour, light and memory. His impression of specific rooms, places, dreams and butterflies are among the fleeting moments that the artist has attempted to capture and convey.

This is the third in a series of exhibitions at The Common Guild's temporary home at 21 Woodlands Terrace: a grand, Victorian townhouse owned by artist Douglas Gordon. It lies to the west of the city centre and next to Kelvingrove Park. Exhibitions take place over two floors and include access to a unique library, designed by Glasgow-based artist Andrew Miller.

The exhibition is presented in association with Finch's major solo exhibition, 'Gravity Always Wins', running concurrently at Dundee Contemporary Arts.

The exhibition continues until 29th November 2008.
